

Charity golf day in aid of Prostate Scotland -

Rules of Play

Playing from the White tees.
Format Texas scramble

1. Texas Scramble Rules

The team handicap is the sum of individual team members' handicaps:

- i) divided by ten for teams of four and
- ii) divided by six for teams of three.

2. TEEING OFF

- a) All players tee-off at each hole.
- b) There must be a minimum number of tee shots used per player during the Round:
 - i) For teams of 4; four tee shots per player.
 - ii) For teams of 3; five tee shots per player.

3. PLAY

- a) After the tee shots have been taken, the nominated team captain then selects the best shot ("The Selected Shot") and marks its position ("The Chosen Position") by placing a marker within 6 inches, at right angles to the line of play not nearer the hole.
- b) The player whose ball has been chosen then plays his shot from where it lies.
- c) The other players, having retrieved their balls, proceed in turn as follows:
 - i) If the Chosen Position is on the Putting Green or a closely mown area, the other players place their balls as close as possible to the Chosen Position and play from there. If a divot has been made by any player, following players may place their balls avoiding the divot. (Not nearer to the hole)
 - ii) If the Chosen Position is located elsewhere (i.e. within a bunker or in the 'rough'), the other players drop their balls and play from where they come to rest. However, the ball shall be re-dropped (only) if it:
 - rolls into and comes to rest in a hazard;
 - rolls out of and comes to rest outside a hazard;
 - rolls onto and comes to rest on a putting green;
 - rolls and comes to rest out of bounds;
 - rolls back into a divot made by a team member playing previously
 - rolls and comes to rest more than one club-length from where it first struck a part of the course; or rolls and comes to rest nearer the hole than the Chosen Position.
 - iii) If the Chosen Position lies within a Bunker, the sand may be raked after each player's shot, before the next player drops his ball.
 - iv) If the Selected Shot lies within a water hazard, the normal Rules of Golf apply in determining the Chosen Position (with a penalty shot being added to the score as normal)

- d) The above method of play is followed until the ball is holed.

4. SCORE

- a) The score is the total number of Selected Shots from tee to holing out. Note! If a player putts and misses but then inadvertently knocks the ball into the hole, then that shot automatically becomes The Selected Shot.
- b) At the end of the Round the total score for each hole is added together and the strokes received are subtracted to give the total net Medal score for the round. The winning team will be the one with the lowest net Medal score.

5. OTHER RULES

- a) All other rules of golf apply to the "Ball in Play"
- b) no gimmies

1. Lodge St John Fisherrow 112

Brief History of Lodge St John

Lodge St John Fisherrow was Chartered on 15th March 1768. The original charter is displayed in the Temple today and was signed by Brother The Right Honourable, 8th Earl of Dalhousie, Most Worshipful Grand Master Mason.

At this time there were two other lodges active in Musselburgh, Lodge Aitcheson Haven, and Musselburgh Kilwinning. Lodge Aitcheson Haven, in existence since 1555 had the oldest known minute book, now displayed in Grand Lodge.

The lodge is unique in that we open in the third degree and all present are tested before the lodge is opened. Our ritual is also unique, being an American ritual used only by a few lodges in Scotland.

3. Newbattle St Mary 1063

During the year 1909, 32 founder members signed a petition for a Charter, to erect a new Lodge, to be designated Lodge Newbattle St. Mary 1063. Some neighbouring Lodges, in the surrounding area, voiced their concern that this could be detrimental to them, and their membership. However, Lodge St. Leonards, Loanhead and Lasswade 580, and Lodge Dalhousie Bonnyrigg 720, sponsored the petition.

At a Quarterly Communication of Grand Lodge, held on 4th November 1909, the petition, proposed by the R.W.P.G.M. of Midlothian, Bro. Col. Lewis M. Hope CB, ADC, and seconded by Bro. Munro Denholm was presented. A large majority granted a Charter.

The first Master Elect of the Lodge Bro. Mungo Mackay, (general manager of the Lothian Coal Company, and a much feared man within the mining community), and the proposed Office Bearers, met the very next evening, Friday, 5th November, in the United Free Church, when Lodge furniture, clothing, and colours were selected. The following Tuesday, 9th November, and each Tuesday thereafter, until the Consecration, Erection, and Installation of Office Bearers, on 1st December 1909. The R.W.P.G.M. and his Officers performed the ceremony. The R.W.M. Bro. Mungo Mackay remained in this Office for three years.

15. Bonnyrigg Dalhousie 720

November the 5th is a date which figures prominently in the history of our nation. On that date in 1885, due to the prompting of Brother Dr John Falconer of St. Annes, Lasswade, The Grand Lodge of Scotland granted a charter to Lodge Dalhousie No. 720.

The Brethren of the new lodge received permission from the Earl of Dalhousie to use the Blue and Gold colours from his coat of arms for the Lodge Regalia. The Lodge met for the first time on the 22nd of February 1886 in the Coffee House, Leyden Place, just 50 metres from the present site of today's lodge rooms.

10. Dalkeith Kilwinning no 10

Historians are often indebted to the records of guilds and societies in their search for the historical facts about the town or country in which they are interested.

10. Dalkeith Kilwinning no 10 continued:

Dalkeith, like all other towns of any importance, had its Trade Guilds, but the only one which has survived the course of years is the Freemasons. According to the Statistical Account of Scotland, the Weavers were established in 1566, the Hammermen in 1694, Shoemakers in 1714, and the Freemasons in 1724. The antiquity of the latter Operative Lodge must, however, go back many years before this date, as reference to it is made in the records of the Melrose Lodge in 1681.

It is interesting to note that, till 1812, Operative Masons were admitted for 10s less than the others. Unfortunately, the earliest records of the Lodge are not available, but there is almost a complete list of the masters from 1736, the date of the constitution of the Grand Lodge of Scotland, at which Dalkeith was represented by **William Stirling** of Herbertshire, and the two Wardens, **Alexander Neilson** and **Mungo Graham**.

From 1764 to the present all the Minute Books are extant, and they record the names of many notable men of the town and neighbourhood who were identified with the activities of the Lodge. **William Drummond** of Hawthornden was Master in 1739, and **Sir James Walker Drummond, Bart.**, who afterwards became Junior Grand Deacon, occupied the Chair from 1848 to 1853. The Lodge is indebted to the latter for the magnificent statue of St. Andrew which adorns the lodge room. In 1742, **Sir Robert Dickson** of Carberry was Master and **Robert Dundas, Esq.**, of Arniston in 1864.

There is much interesting information in the Minutes of the habits and customs of former generations, and it is noteworthy that benevolence has been kept in the forefront of our principles
