Information

We provide information, leaflets and booklets covering a range of topics from raising awareness to detailed information about prostate disease/ cancer and treatments.

Awareness

Our credit card sized 'Brief guide to prostate disease/cancer' is packed full of useful information and can be discreetly slipped into a pocket to read later.

Introductory guides

Providing a bit more information but remaining easy to read guides covering topics about the prostate, PSA, enlarging prostate, prostatitis and cancer.

Explanatory guides

Covering early and advanced prostate cancer, prostatitis and BPH these are in-depth guides and can be provided as back up information to the clinical consultation.

Spotlight on guides

These take a more in depth look at a particular test, treatment or care issue. Our **COMPASS** service offers a range of support to help men and their families navigate their way through prostate cancer. The following services are available:

Living Well with Prostate Cancer course

A 7 week course for people having treatment, or finished treatment for prostate cancer. The opportunity to hear from experts and meet others in a similar situation. We look at side effects, the practicalities of having prostate cancer and what individuals can do to live well.

One-to-one support service

Talk to a Cancer Support Specialist – they'll listen, answer questions and guide individuals to the right information about anything from diagnosis to treatment options or side effects.

Exercise programmes

Grab your trainers and take a look at the exercise video on our website developed specifically for men with prostate cancer.



In addition, from 2022 we will offer a 12 week exercise programme for individuals with prostate cancer.

Films and information available online

The Prostate Scotland website is a comprehensive source of information about prostate cancer and disease. It includes an interactive tool, resources, and videos by consultant urologists and oncologists, and men sharing their story. There are also two excellent videos on how to do pelvic floor exercises before and after radical prostatectomy.

From 2022, we will have a Prostate Scotland app for men diagnosed with prostate cancer. The app has a range of tools including a PSA tracker, appointment and medication reminder, living with prostate cancer trackers, and a tool to help compare prostate cancer treatments and a host of helpful resources.

Raising awareness in the workplace
